My Stroke Guide

My Stroke Guide is an interactive website designed to allow users to take control of their recovery following a stroke, by enabling them to manage their own health and wellbeing through its wide range of features and trusted information.

We'll work closely with you to set your own goals on the guides personalised goal setting tool, whilst providing the practical tools to help people understand stroke and deal with its effects. We also offer peer support to help combat isolation.

How does it work?

- Either you, your carer, your GP or a healthcare or socialcare professional can contact us to refer you
- We'll arrange to visit you at home
- We offer information, advice and support to you, your family or carer, and if applicable introduce you to My Stroke Guide
- We'll design a programme to help you achieve your goals
- You can choose to join a local group for additional activities and support.
